# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **END OF TERM 2**

#### **SEMESTER 1 REPORTS**

Semester 1 reports were sent home on Friday. Twice a year, teachers report on student achievement based on assessments and information collected about student learning. Our teachers have written extensive reports that cover all Key Learning Areas. I would like to congratulate the students of Corrimal Public School on their fantastic achievements and conscientious efforts towards learning throughout Semester 1. Please take the time to celebrate your child's successes with them and discuss areas they may need to improve. #### **BRONZE, SILVER AND GOLD**

A reminder that when your child achieves a level in our reward system, there is a process required to ensure the level is acknowledged. As students receive 10 awards they must bring their awards to the office, where the awards will be taken, the student's name recorded and a Bronze Certificate written before the awards are returned to the student at a later time. The Bronze Award will then be presented at the next School Assembly. This process is the same for Silver and Gold, though the student is only required to bring the additional five certificates each time the next level is achieved. There are lots of levels being attained at the present time and I congratulate all students striving to be the best they can be.

## Ethics Classes at Corrimal Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Could you be an ethics teacher for Corrimal Public School?

We are seeking volunteers so that ethics classes are available for all families who have requested them.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 12.45pm, every Wednesday each week to teach a forty-five minute class. A small amount of weekly preparation (such as printing and reading through lesson materials) is also required.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- -imagining how others feel
- -how do we treat living things?
- -what is laziness?
- -how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- -fairness

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## **Ethics Classes at Corrimal Public School**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available as an option in NSW public primary schools during the Special Religious Education/Special Education in Ethics (SRE/SEE or 'scripture') timeslot. Primary Ethics is the charity authorised by the Department of Education to create curriculum and train volunteers to deliver ethics classes. The ethics curriculum is available for children from Kindergarten through to year 6.

Ethics classes are discussion based, covering a range of age-appropriate topics. Children learn to express their own views as well as to listen carefully to, and consider, the views of others.

Ethics classes are delivered by trained volunteers using approved lesson materials. Volunteers are usually parents from the school community including:

- Ethics teachers who deliver classes each week
- An ethics coordinator who recruits and supports volunteer teachers and liaises with the school to organise classes

Ethics classes are currently being taught across the school, with positions available to families wishing for their child to have this opportunity.




