### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

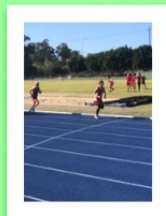

The Bronze Award will then be presented at the next School Assembly. This process is the same for Silver and Gold, though the student is only required to bring the additional five certificates each time the next level is achieved. There are lots of levels being attained at the present time and I congratulate all students striving to be the best they can be.

This morning we had an unfortunate situation where Ms Holland tripped and fell as she was walking to cross the street after being dropped off at school. As she landed, she did significant damage to her elbow and an ambulance was called to ensure all precautions were covered. All students were notified of the incident, so as not to have the incorrect story being relayed.

This afternoon, Ms Holland contacted me and she has broken her elbow and will require surgery. This surgery will occur on Wednesday of this week. The students of Arinya will have appropriate arrangements to ensure their school programs continue, until we receive an idea of the time-frame in which Ms Holland will be absent from school.

### LIBRARY NEWS

Last term our **Annual Scholastic Book Fair** was a wonderful success thanks to the wonderful support of our students, parents and school community. We have earned over \$1,100 in books that I will choose for our school library. Thank you for your great support!

For the students who are still waiting on an order from the Book Fair I will deliver them as soon as they arrive. I apologise on behalf of Scholastic Book Fair for the long wait as they have had to put in a new computer system and they have not been able to process any orders. I will include a complimentary stationery item with the book when it arrives. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **NSW Premier's Reading Challenge**

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is open for 2018. K-2 students will be listening to and reading their 30 books from the PRC list during their library lessons and I will enter the books online for their student records. Years 3 -6 students need to read 20 books (15 from the PRC list and 5 free choice). Students can see me for a reading log to record their books or they can enter the books online on the Premier's Reading Challenge website using their student portal password. The list of books can be found on the PRC website. **Student reading records must be completed by 31st August 2018.** Students who complete the PRC Challenge will receive a PRC certificate and could be listed on the PRC site.

**Book Week** will be on later this term. It might be a good idea to start thinking of some ideas of what you might like to dress up as!

We also have a quite a number of outstanding books from the library. Please look at home to see if you have any library books that need returning. Thank you for your cooperation.

### READING



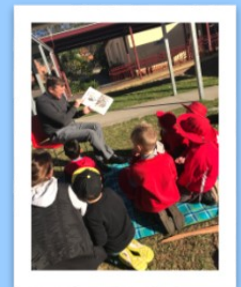
This semester, in my role as Instructional Leader at our school, I will be working with all staff and students with a focus on reading. This work started last week, working with teachers 1:1 to analyse data and co-plan reading lessons for the next three weeks.

We have also just spent \$2500 on a range of reading material for K-2. This equates to 69 new titles, over 200 new books for our students. This order should arrive this week and will be in classrooms the following week. Teachers are excited to have these new books at their disposal and they will greatly support the teaching of reading to our K-2 students. I will also be working with years 3-6 in the coming weeks to select reading material for them to enjoy as well.

Please keep in mind the importance of reading at home regularly. It is great to read to our young children but as they get older we can read the same book that our child is reading and then discuss what is happening – just like a book club.

Mrs Scard in the library has also recently started 'The Weirdo Book Club'. This book club meets during Wednesday lunch times, shares food that Mrs Scard prepares, last week it was pancakes and discusses a book they are all reading. The Weirdo series by Anh Do was selected by one group and is a very entertaining book.

Please keep in mind that I am reading to all preschool students each Monday morning at 8.45am. Any children are welcome and I don't mind if they stay for a few pages and then wander off. As you can see from the photos it is a nice way to start the day and I always have a few big brothers and sisters join in as well.
