# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### SCHOOL SWIMMING AND WATER SAFETY PROGRAM

This year, our School Swimming and Water Safety Program will commence on Monday 5th November. This year all students in Year 2 will be attending swim scheme but we also have places for students in year 3-6 who cannot swim 25 metres. There is no charge for instruction, only \$27 per student for pool entry each day. If you would like your child to participate in this program please complete the attached permission note and speak with your child's class teacher.

#### **SICK STUDENTS**

During last term and last week, there have been a number of students reporting to sick bay asking to go home. At times, students will often say something along the lines of; "Mum/Dad told me, if I felt unwell to come to the office and then I could go home." If we say this to our children in the morning then I am pretty sure most students will take up this option. #### A NOTE FROM THE OFFICE

If students with bus passes need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.



#### School Swimming & Water Safety Program

Dear Parents / Carers,

The Department of Education and Communities School Swimming and Water Safety Program is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. Our School Swimming Scheme will commence on Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2018 and continue for two weeks until Friday 16<sup>th</sup> November 2018. There is no charge for instruction, only \$27 per student for pool entry each day.

This year, all Year 2 students will be participating in this program. Further places will be offered to students who are in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 and have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills, and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water, are eligible to participate in the School Swimming Scheme.

Swimming instruction will take place at Corrimal Swimming Pool each morning at 9.15am. We will be walking to and from the pool each day, departing at 8.30am sharp. Students should arrive dressed with their swimming costume under their school uniform and have a bag that contains, a towel, a hat and goggles if required. Sunscreen can be applied at home before arriving at school.

Students will be assessed during the School Swimming and Water Safety Program for all water safety skills without wearing goggles. They will be allowed to wear goggles during the swimming instruction.

Places are limited in this program! Please return permission note and money to the office by Wednesday 31st October 2018.

#### **Ethics Classes at Corrimal Public School**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available as an option in NSW public primary schools during the Special Religious Education/Special Education in Ethics (SRE/SEE or 'scripture') timeslot. Primary Ethics is the charity authorised by the Department of Education to create curriculum and train volunteers to deliver ethics classes. The ethics curriculum is available for children from Kindergarten through to year 6.

Ethics classes are discussion based, covering a range of age-appropriate topics. Children learn to express their own views as well as to listen carefully to, and consider, the views of others.

Ethics classes are delivered by trained volunteers using approved lesson materials. Volunteers are usually parents from the school community including:

- Ethics teachers who deliver classes each week
- An ethics coordinator who recruits and supports volunteer teachers and liaises with the school to organise classes

Ethics classes can commence at Corrimal Public School if there is sufficient interest and enough volunteers to deliver the program.

#### Ethics Classes at Corrimal Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Could you be an ethics teacher for Corrimal Public School?

We are seeking volunteers so that ethics classes are available for all families who have requested them.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 12.45, every Wednesday each week to teach a half hour class. A small amount of weekly preparation (such as printing and reading through lesson materials) is also required.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- -imagining how others feel
- -how do we treat living things?
- -what is laziness?
- -how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- -fairness


