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NAPLAN

A reminder that all students in years 3,5,7 and 9 are involved in NAPLAN assessment next week from Tuesday, May 14th to Friday, May 24th. These are National Tests that cover a wide range of topics form literacy, spelling, grammar and punctuation, writing and numeracy. This year Corrimal Public School students will be completing the test online, except for Year 3 writing which will be a pen and paper test. Students are advised to stay calm throughout the tasks and try and get a good night's rest between each assessment. Staff will be on hand to make sure all students manage the process well. Please remember they are tests taken on one day and don't measure how sporty, creative or what a good friend your child is, or how they relate to adults or their peers.

OPPORTUNITY CLASS PLACEMENT FOR YEAR 5 IN 2020

Opportunity classes cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students, teaching them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Opportunity Class Placement test results and school assessment scores.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The application website opens on **30th April 2019** and closes on **Friday, 17th May 2019**. No late applications will be accepted.

SCHOOL HOURS

A reminder that school is supervised **from 8.30am**. It has been alarming the number of students that are arriving at school by 8:00am. In an emergency there is a quiet waiting area in the outdoor kitchen/BBQ COLA if you need to drop your child at school before 8.30am on occasions. Our school day finishes at **3:00pm** and any student that is not collected by their parent or carer should be leaving the school at that time. There are many students not going home straight away and staying to play in the playground without supervision. We would appreciate your support in assisting us with this by speaking with your child/children so that they are safe at all times.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

We have been revising some of our procedures and protocols around digital technology and the use of iPads and computers in the school. You will see more about this in the coming weeks but something we are sending home this week is a technology use agreement. This will be something that every student will sign at the beginning of every year to ensure we are all being respectful users of technology at Corrimal Public School. At this stage the agreement has only been sent home to students from Year 3-6 to be discussed with you and signed by both your child and yourself. We are starting with the older students first and will involve our younger students in time.

Please take the time to discuss and sign the agreement with your child/children and return to the class teacher as soon as possible. We appreciate your support with helping our students to be responsible digital citizens.

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ATTENDANCE

If you are experiencing difficulties with getting your children to school, please let us know. You can speak to your child's classroom teacher, an executive member, or the front office staff about how we may assist you. Our aim is to correct attendance issues as soon as they arise.

MAKING PAYMENTS

When paying by cash please ensure correct money is sent in as change is not always available straight away. Once receipting and banking has been completed receipts and change are sent back to the class teacher to hand back to your child.

All payments and permission slips are to be placed in our payment box located on the wall in the office.





Ethics classes are run on Wednesdays from 12:45pm – 1:30pm.


