PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

TERM 2 - ALMOST OVER

Almost half way through the school year, how did we get here this quickly? It has been a busy term and we still have quite a few things happening this week before the end of term. On Tuesday I have Lunch with Leaders again, this time it is the Soccer Refs turn. Reports are also being sent home on Tuesday. Thank you to the people who have volunteered a helping hand on the day. Our debating team have their next competition round at our school on Thursday morning against Austinmer and of course it is our Silver Award Morning Tea celebration as well. To end the week with a bit of fun we have our SRC fundraiser – mufti day (more on this later in the newsletter).

SRC – DETERMINED TO REDUCE THE USE OF PLASTIC IN OUR SCHOOL

It is fabulous when student voice comes together and displays a passion for saving our environment. The SRC voted on many ideas from the class meetings that were held and decided to undertake the task of trying to reduce the amount of plastic we use in the school, starting with removing plastic straws in the canteen. The canteen have sourced paper straws and not only are they more environmentally friendly, they are actually cheaper to buy so that is an extra bonus.

The canteen are also looking at using 'keep cups' for slushies. This would involve your child bringing their own reusable cup to school and taking it to the canteen to buy a slushy, a more sustainable and eco-friendly method. This removes the need to supply plastic cups and again reduces the amount of plastic we are using at school. Students will be encouraged to rinse their cup before putting it back in their lunchbox to prevent ants and sticky mess.

PARKING IN THE KISS AND DROP ZONE

Kiss and Drop Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle.

Unfortunately it has been reported to the office that there are parents or carers parking in the kiss and drop zone and leaving their vehicle to wait for their child in the school grounds. Rangers do patrol the area and will issue parking fines if they see this occur. Please ensure you follow the rules and keep our students safe at all times.

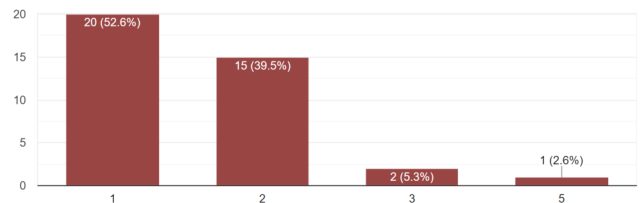

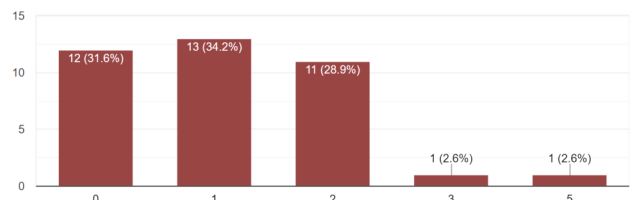
The survey on the plan to change School Banking from the Commonwealth Bank to the IMB has closed.

Overall we received 38 responses, with the majority in favour of the move. You can see the results below:

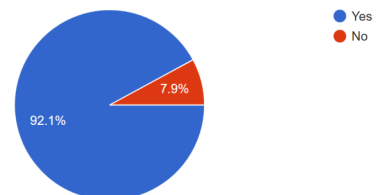
How many children do you have enrolled at Corrimal Public School?



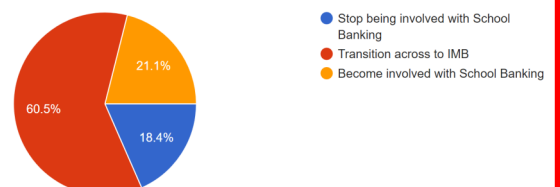
How many children do you currently have enrolled in School Banking?
