STUDENT ABSENCES

It has come to my attention that there is some confusion around when to provide a medical certificate for a student absence and why the school may be requesting this from parents. The Department of Education has requirements set out in the School Attendance Policy that schools must adhere to. This policy can be found by following the link below:

A few key points from the policy are outlined below

Attendance and absences

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- *being sick or having an infectious disease
- *having an unavoidable medical appointment
- *being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- *exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Principals or their delegates:

- *will undertake all reasonable measures to contact parents promptly and within two school days of absence being unexplained, if contact has not already been made.
- *are responsible for ensuring that when frequent absences are explained as being due to illness that medical certificates are sought for the absences.
