### DANGEROUS RIDING OF SCOOTERS

We have many of our students riding to school on bikes and scooters which is a great way for them to exercise. Unfortunately we have had many concerned citizens calling the school regarding unsafe riding from some of our girls who ride to school via Wilga St. One particular incident that was reported sounded like the students were extremely lucky to have not been hit by a car, as they just rode out from the school and straight across the road in front of oncoming cars. Other students have been seen riding in the middle of the road and almost being wiped out by car doors opening.

I am extremely concerned for the safety of your children when arriving and leaving the school grounds. If your child rides a bike or a scooter to school, please talk to them about safety and where they should be riding. I will be watching carefully to see who these children are and will contact you to let you know. It would be terrible if someone were to get hurt.

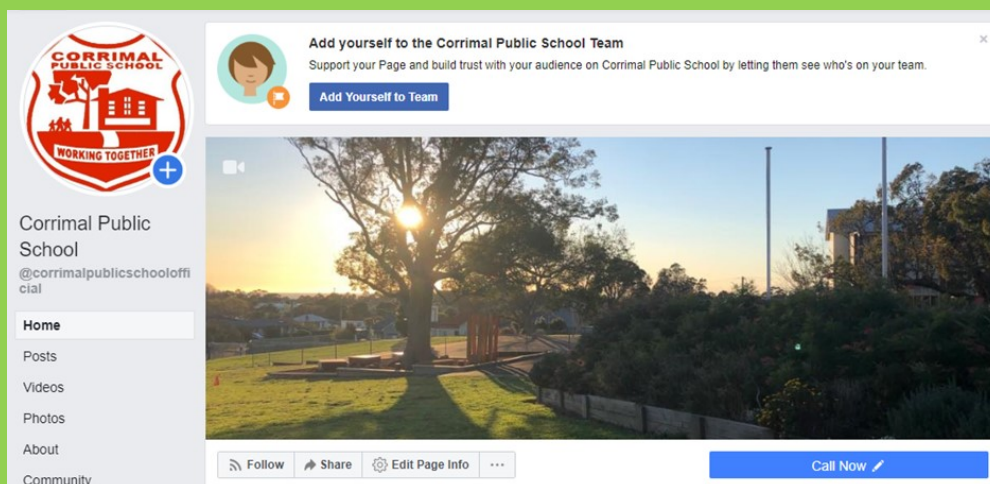
### NAPLAN

NAPLAN results arrived at school last week and were handed to all Year 3 and 5 students on Friday in a sealed envelope. If your child was away on Friday they will bring the envelope home this week. This year we did NAPLAN online and we were lucky as we had very little difficulty with our technology thanks to Mrs Giesajtis and the hard work she put in before the testing period.

Please keep in mind that NAPLAN provides a snapshot of students' assessment at a point in time. Results need to be interpreted with care and should be considered together with school-based assessments. Your child's teacher will have the best insight into your child's academic progress and I encourage you to contact them if you have any questions.

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## Week 10 Term 3

### NEW ENROLMENT POLICY

On Monday 22 July 2019, the Department of Education implemented new enrolment procedures for all Government Schools in NSW. These procedures involve a range of new guidelines including changes to the residential address check and out of area applications.

#### **Residential Address Check:**

Under the Education Act 1990, principals require proof of address to establish a child's entitlement to enrol in the school. As such, we must now use the following 100-point residential address check to determine the student's entitlement to enrol at the school.

Document showing the full name of the child's parent	Points
1. Only one of (i.e. no additional points for additional documents) 1.1. Council rates notice 1.2. Lease agreement through a registered real estate agent for a period of at least 6 months or rental board bond receipt 1.3. Exchanged contract of sale with settlement to occur within the applicable school year	40
2. Any of the following 2.1. Private rental agreement for a period of at least 6 months 2.2. Centrelink payment statement showing home address 2.3. Electoral roll statement	20 each
3. Any of the following documents 3.1. Electricity or gas bill showing the service address* 3.2. Water bill showing the service address* 3.3. Telephone or internet bill showing the service address* 3.4. Drivers licence or government issued ID showing home address* 3.5. Home building or home contents insurance showing the service address 3.6. Motor vehicle registration or compulsory third party insurance policy showing home address 3.7. 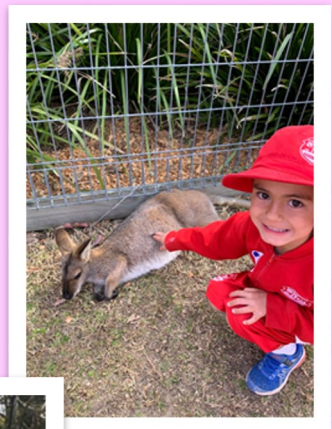
#### ***Ace – Cooinda***

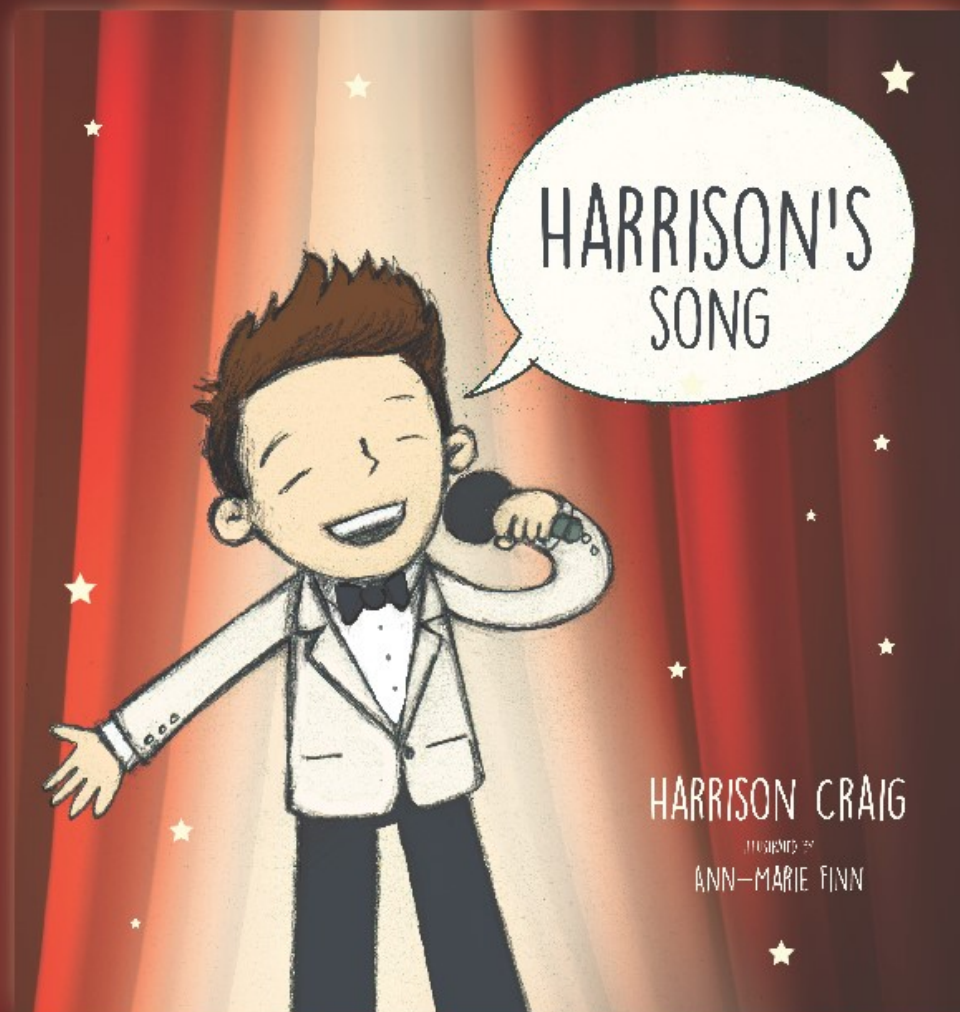

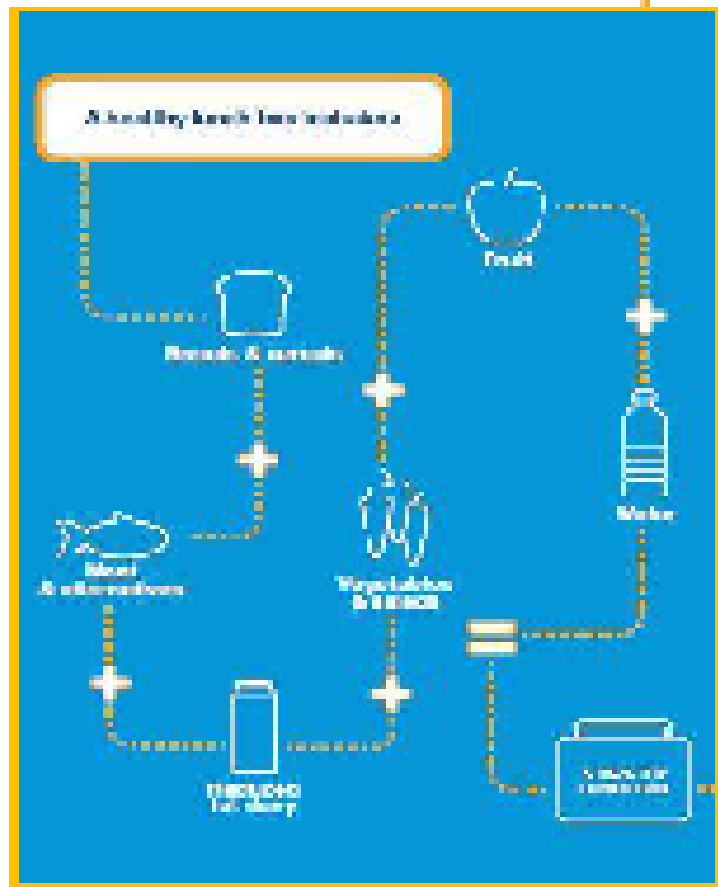
