A program supporting mothers to raise happy, respectful, non violent boys aged 6-8 years old.

What happens?

The program is run by a female and male facilitator over six weekly sessions, two hours in length. The day will include mothers and their sons working together however have times where you will be doing separate activities.

Afternoon tea is provided, and limited child minding is available for siblings.

The sessions explore the role of the mother and where parenting skills and ideas come from; emotion regulation; the importance of male role models in a son's life and what masculinity means today. As a group we focus on the developing of a strong, enduring and positive connections between mothers and sons and healthy relationships beyond the family sphere.

Why a Mothers and Sons program?

We know there are increasing rates of son to mother violence, and we have been asked by many mothers for guidance and support on how to raise their sons, so they become respectful men.

As there are no programs like this in Australia, we developed our own (called Mothers and Sons Program!). It is specifically designed for boys 6-8 years old, as research tells us this is the critical time to teach boys not to be violent.

It doesn't mean the boys are violent now, or they have challenging behaviours – we just want to give both mother and son skills and strategies to make sure it never happens.

"After attending the program my son has been able to tell me when he is about to 'flip his lid', so we can then help him calm down"

The biggest opportunity to build strong bones is in childhood, when children are still growing.
