NAPLAN ONLINE

Our Year 3 and 5 students will be completing their NAPLAN assessments online in term two during weeks three and four. Our school will be participating in a number of readiness tests in the next few weeks to ensure that our students are ready to complete this online assessment. If you have any further questions about this, please don't hesitate to see your child's classroom teacher.

NAPLAN PUBLIC DEMONSTRATION SITE

The public demonstration site helps students understand the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN Online tests. It also provides an opportunity for students who may need some extra practice to experience using the interactive navigation of the online test, trial the online tools and to establish adjustments that may be appropriate for students with disability.

In advance of taking NAPLAN Online, students, teachers and parents are invited to use the public demonstration tests to familiarise themselves with the type of questions and related functionalities available in the NAPLAN Online assessment.

Some of the key features include a range of question types, onscreen tools, timers and interactive navigation. Students are encouraged to try all the tests for their year level to practice the complete range of question formats available in the online assessment.

The demonstration tests cover a sample of possible questions and do not reflect the range of literacy and numeracy content or skills NAPLAN Online will assess. While it is helpful for students to become familiar and comfortable with the format of the online test, ACARA does not encourage students to study separately for NAPLAN. That is why you will not find answers to the demonstration tests.


