NWPSSA Stage 2 and 3 Gala Day (Rescheduled)

This term, **Stages 2 and 3** will be participating in **NWPSSA Gala Days** at Corrimal East Public School and Bellambi Public School. These events are designed for all students to participate in and are purely focused on fun, fitness and fairness.

The **Term 3 Gala Day** will take place on **Tuesday September 10th (Week 8)**. It is a full-day event that takes place within school hours. **Stage 2** will be playing **soccer** at **Bellambi Public School** and **Stage 3** will be playing **Oz-Tag** at **Corrimal East Public School**. Please note that Gala Days are not optional events, and that all students are expected to attend.

Students will be taking buses to and from each venue, leaving at 9.20am and arriving back at school at 2.30pm. The cost for the bus is **\$5.50** per student. As this event was postponed from Term 2, if you have already paid you will not need to provide additional payment. You will, however, all need to sign and return this new consent form please.

Please note that **Stage 2** students **MUST** wear shinpads when playing soccer. Please arrange for your child to have a pair available on the day. We have a very limited number of CPS shinpads that may be shared around, however if your child requires the use of these, you must inform your classroom teacher beforehand.

Please also note that students are **not permitted to wear football boots**. Instead, please ensure that your child has appropriate footwear (which includes their regular sports shoes/joggers).

Concussion acknowledgement

- I acknowledge that if my child has sustained a concussion in the lead up to the event, I must provide medical clearance to the school or the supervising teacher prior to competition commencing.
- I understand that if my child sustains a concussion or suspected concussion during an NSW Department of Education sporting event, they will be removed from competition until medical clearance is provided to the supervising teacher.

Personal injury statement

In the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. The Department's public liability cover is fault-based and limited to breaches by the Department of its duty of care to students that may result in claims for compensation.

Parents/Carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region and state school sport associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover is required prior to their child's involvement in the program. Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail outlets.

Parents/Carers who have private ambulance cover need to check whether that cover extends to interstate travel and make additional arrangements as considered appropriate.

The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or the loss of use of certain prescribed parts of the body.
