Times	Start	Students are to be at school by 9am. Note: If competing in 1500m, meet at the venue for 8:30am start.	Finish
			3pm at school, or parents can sign their child out at Beaton Park at the conclusion of the event.
What to Wear	Suitable sports shoes and socks. Please encourage children to wear clothing in their house colours. Please note- Students will be competing in the age group they will be turning in 2024. Spikes can only be worn for 'track events' 100m & 200m.		
What you need to bring	Hat, water and appropriate food for an athlete. P&C will be running a canteen on the day. More information to come soon.		
Transport	Bus <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Under 8's-12's Bus (non 1500m competitors) - Leaving school at 9:15am and arriving back at 2:30pm. Under 5's-7's Bus - Leaving school at 9:30am and arriving back at 2:00pm. Travel to the carnival by bus is compulsory. If you wish to take your child home at the conclusion of the carnival, please see the staff at the sign out table. Cost of the bus will not be deducted if you choose to take your child home at the conclusion of the carnival. 1500m Competitors - To meet at Beaton Park by 8:30am. Note: If you are competing in the 1500m running race you will need to arrange your own transport to the venue and be at Beaton Park by 8:30am. This event is open to all students turning 8 or older this year.

Concussion acknowledgement

- I acknowledge that if my child has sustained a concussion in the lead up to the event, I must provide medical clearance to the school or the supervising teacher prior to competition commencing.
- I understand that if my child sustains a concussion or suspected concussion during an NSW Department of Education sporting event, they will be removed from competition until medical clearance is provided to the supervising teacher.

Personal injury statement

In the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. The Department's public liability cover is fault-based and limited to breaches by the Department of its duty of care to students that may result in claims for compensation.

Parents/Carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region and state school sport associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover is required prior to their child's involvement in the program. Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail outlets.

Parents/Carers who have private ambulance cover need to check whether that cover extends to interstate travel and make additional arrangements as considered appropriate.

The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or the loss of use of certain prescribed parts of the body. - ✓ Give your best and demonstrate exemplary sportsmanship at all times
- ✓ Play for your own enjoyment and benefit
- ✓ Cooperate with team mates, coaches and all officials - without them you do not have a competition
- ✓ Follow the rules at all times
- ✓ The School Sport Unit and all sporting associations have a proud record – strive to uphold it both on and off the sporting arena.

Teachers, team management and officials' code of conduct

- ✓ Place the safety and welfare of students above all else
- ✓ Set a good example for students/participants
- ✓ Teach students the rules and to be respectful of all officials
- ✓ Develop student potential and support learning with positive feedback and encouragement
